RESOLVED an application has been duly made to the Board of the **Town of Macedon, County of Wayne,** New York, by **Spectrum Northeast, LLC**, an indirect subsidiary of Charter Communications, Inc. ("Charter"), a limited liability company organized and existing in good standing under the laws of State of Delaware doing business at 2604 Seneca Avenue, Niagara Falls, NY 14305, for the approval of a renewal agreement for Charter's cable television franchise for fifteen (15) years commencing with the date of approval by the Public Service Commission.

The franchise renewal agreement would bring the franchise into conformity with certain provisions of the Federal Cable Communications Policy Act of 1984, as amended, and certain court rulings.

A public hearing was held in the Town of Macedon, New York on June, 13, 2024 at 7:15 P.M. and notice of the hearing was published in the Time of Wayne County on May 25, 2024.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Board of the Town of Macedon finds that:

- 1. Spectrum Northeast, LLC has substantially complied with the material terms and conditions of its existing franchise and with applicable law; and
- 2. Spectrum Northeast, LLC has the financial, legal, and technical ability to provide these services, facilities, and equipment as set forth in its proposal attached; and
- 3. Spectrum Northeast, LLC can reasonably meet the future cable-related community needs and interests, taking into account the cost of meeting such needs and interests.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board of the **Town of Macedon** hereby grants the cable television franchise of Spectrum Northeast, LLC and the **Town of Macedon** for fifteen (15) years commencing with the date of approval by the Public Service Commission and expiring fifteen (15) years hence.

The draft of Local Law No. 1 (2024) Regulate Special Events in the Town of Macedon & Local Law No. 2 (2024) Regluates the Operation of Agricultural Event Venues in the Town of Macedon will need to have a workshop on June 17, 2024 at 5:00pm. In order for these Local Laws to be voted on the board needs to present drafts that are being presented at the public hearing. Once this has happened then public hearings for the local laws are then presented and scheduled to take place.

ROUNDTABLE:

ASSESSOR: Grievence day was May 28th and the Board of Assessment review met for a total of five hours and had a total of three property owners that came in person plus a few residents applied but did not come in person. There was a total of 13 grievence applications, seven of them are commercial property owners, there was a couple of on going section 7 cases. There was one commercial one that was filed with a lot of discrepencies in the grivence application and it indicated that the Assessor to stipulate with them but they put a different figure than what they felt the assessment should be so the Board of Assessment review did not take any action for that case.

The Assessor put in her report the burrent final roll total that was submitted to the county. So compared to 2023 it went up over 8 Million dollars and that may change with some of the ongoing current Article 7 cases which the Assessor is hoping to get some of those resolved this summer.

My department has already started working on the 2025 Assessment Roll and we have a lot of new construction coming on the roll this year and anticipate that the 8 million will be a lot higher next year.

The appraisel was received from the county and the county did pay for appraisel of the Town's property so that will be addressed in the 2025 roll.

Councilman Maul asked if the Assessor thinks the next reval will be and she has contacted an associate that assists behind the scenes part of the reval and will be approaching the board with potientially contracting with her. The Assessor would like to start this summer for the 2026 roll.

Michael Coyguyt from LaBella Associates spoke about the grants that are in process and closed. Also passed out and spoke about the Capital Improvement Grants for Pro-Housing Communities Program.

HIGHWAY: First round of oil and stone on Eddy Rd and Weidrick Rd all the way to Scott Rd and from Creek Rd from Cty 28 Rd to Rt. 31 and I be working on the guide rail on Creek Rd. Will be sealing the open drainage pipe and then oil and stone that project as well as will be starting the oil and stone on Daansen Rd. The highway department has started to stock pile the millings at Bullis Park for the walkways. Work continues on Brooktee Circle and still on schedule to be paved in July and a couple guys went to Parkwood and cleaned up the light poles.

The lightpoles on Locust Circle and Evergreen Hills are a priority on the list to be fixed. The question was asked to who is responsible for the light poles and it is the NY Power Authority.
